

# INTERNATIONAL HEAD OF LIONS IN DALLAS

ANNOUNCES PROGRAM FOR BIG  
MEETING IN DALLAS  
OCT. 8-9.

Dr. W. F. Woods, president of the International Association of Lions Clubs, arrived in Dallas at 10 o'clock yesterday morning from his home in Evansville, Ind., to attend the first annual convention of the association, which will open here Monday morning. Dr. Woods, who is a prominent physician of Indiana, and operating surgeon at the Deaconess Hospital at Evansville, said he came here early in order to become acquainted with the committees and to be of assistance in planning for the meeting.

The convention will open Monday morning with a social session, after which the meeting will be called to order. There will be a roll call of the officers and of the representatives of the various clubs. The following committees will be appointed: Credentials, resolutions and constitution, business methods and conventions, publicity, education, public affairs, club ethics and elections. Announcements and unfinished business will complete the morning program.

The afternoon session will be taken up with the nomination of officers and trustees, the nomination and election of district directors, the reading of papers and addresses by delegates.
